## How to License Your Pet with the Village of Greendale



### Village of Greendale Ordinance 12.04-Animals

- Any dog or cat over 5 months old must be licensed
  - Must present proof of immunization and spay/neuter
  - Fee is double for pets who are NOT spayed/neutered
  - Attach license tag to animal collar
  - Renew license at Village Hall (423-2100) or with MADACC, madacc.org (649-8640)
  - Permit from Jan 1 to Dec 31
- Must be licensed by March 31<sup>st</sup> to avoid late fees

### 8 reasons to license your pet:

- K9 Nova says so
- It proves your pet is properly vaccinated
- Your pet has a better chance of being returned home if lost
- Your pet will be safer at the shelter (licensed pets are kept longer at shelters and are less likely to be euthanized)
- It's cheap
- It's quick
- Our local shelters are supported by the fees
- It's the law

### FREE Memory Screen

Are you concerned about your memory? It is important, as we get older, to recognize the changes we may experience, especially in relation to our memory. A cognitive screen/memory screen is defined as a wellness tool that helps identify possible changes in memory and cognition. It creates a baseline of where a person is at so that future changes can be monitored. This is not a diagnostic tool, but a screen that can provide early detection for dementia. The memory screen process is very simple in which you will be asked to answer some questions and complete a task. The screen takes about 15-30 minutes.

Early detection is important because: It allows persons with dementia to prioritize and to be proactive in planning for their futures; Current treatments are more effective in earlier stages of Alzheimer's Disease; There is greater opportunity to educate caregivers; It may improve quality of life for persons with dementia and their families and may help to control long term care costs. The memory screens will be provided by Candice LeGros, Dementia Care Specialist, Milwaukee County Aging and Disability Resource Center. ### The Tick Forecast: What You Need to Know This Summer

Illnesses spread by ticks are common in Wisconsin. Not all ticks spread illness and you won't get sick from every tick bite,

but it is important to make sure you stay aware of ticks, the illnesses they cause, and how to prevent the bites. Ticks can be encountered whenever the ground is above freezing and not covered with snow. Protect yourself by using insect repellent containing 20% DEET, place play equipment in areas away from woods or bushes, and when hiking avoid walking off marked trails or recreation areas. Perform tick checks regularly on clothing and skin after being outside. Don't forget to check your pet too! If you find a tick, safely remove the tick\*, place it in a sealed plastic bag, and contact your healthcare provider. To help with tick prevention, identification, and removal, the Greendale Health Department will have \*FREE tick kits available for pick up during business hours. ### Village Burning Codes

#### 14.08 (3) FIRE PITS

(3) RECREATIONAL BURNING (Wood Burning Appliance) A recreational fire is defined as a fire to be used for cooking, or esthetics benefit similar to that of a campfire. The fire shall be confined to a commercially designed outdoor wood burning appliance.

(a) Requirements on size and location of recreational fires, and general requirements.

1. Fires shall be in an approved outdoor appliance less than or equal to 3 feet in diameter and less than or equal to 3 feet in height.
2. The fire area shall be protected by a screen or wire mesh as to hold down any flying embers.
3. Fires shall contain only wood or charcoal; any other building materials are prohibited.
4. The wind velocity may not exceed 10 mph.
5. Fires shall NOT be started or accelerated using flammable liquids, such as gasoline.
6. The fire must be a minimum of 10 feet from all structures, roadways, and lot lines.
7. The outdoor appliance shall not be used on any deck or wooden surface.
8. If smoke travels in such a manner that it obscures roadways, if the fire department receives complaints from the area, or it is deemed to be a hazard, the Fire Official reserves the right to require that the fire be extinguished.

### Grilling on Balconies

The use of grills on the balconies of any apartment building is prohibited. At ground level grills shall not be used within 10 feet of any structure and at least 36" away from any combustibles when operated. Liquid propane grills are not allowed above the ground floor and LP cylinders are never to be stored or transported through the building. They cannot be lifted to the balcony on the exterior of the building.

### Adopt a Hydrant

If there is a fire hydrant in your yard or your neighbors please make sure that it is clear from bushes, shrubs, and overgrown vegetation. Please don't plant or put decorative lawn ornaments around them to hide them. They maybe not be pleasing to the eye but they may save your house or your life or a loved ones life some day.
